Course description:

CADS (Canadian Adaptive Snowsports) Certification Courses are instructor training courses set by the CADS Technical Committee. Each division's course conductors follow specific criteria to train and certify instructors to teach skiing and snowboarding to persons with a disability.

Any strong intermediate skier or snowboarder, with or without a disability, 15 years or older, who is interested in teaching persons with disabilities about the "joys" of skiing or snowboarding may take this course.

A CADS Certification Course will provide information and teaching skills about working with persons disabilities. **The CADS Ski / SB Level 1 certification covers the 4 modules Visual Impairment, Sit-Ski, 3/4 track (Outriggers) and Neurodiversity.** Candidates will learn tools and skills to support learners living with physical and/or cognitive disabilities. You will also learn the assessment of abilities, teaching strategies, communication and the use of some adaptive equipment. The course will take place online and on snow, and follows the evaluation criteria set out in the CADS Level 1 booklet. For more information go to: www.cads.ski
